Together, let's celebrate and take part in this evolving vision of Western living.

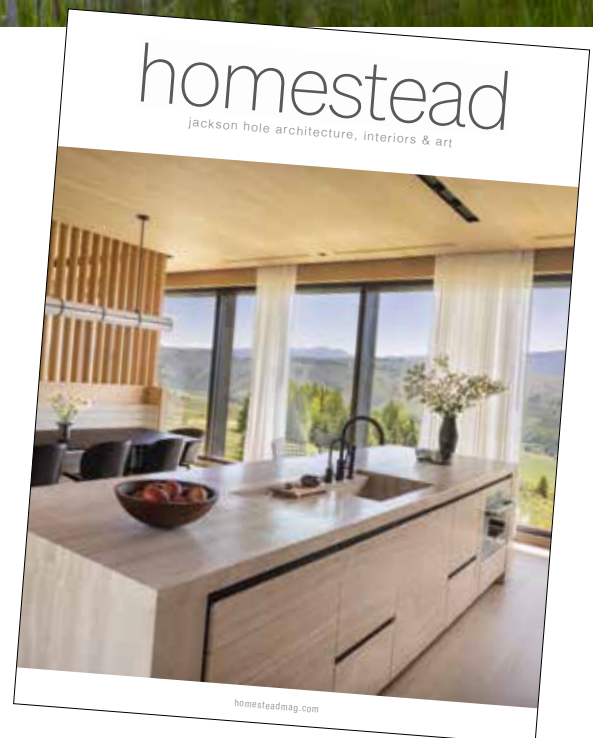

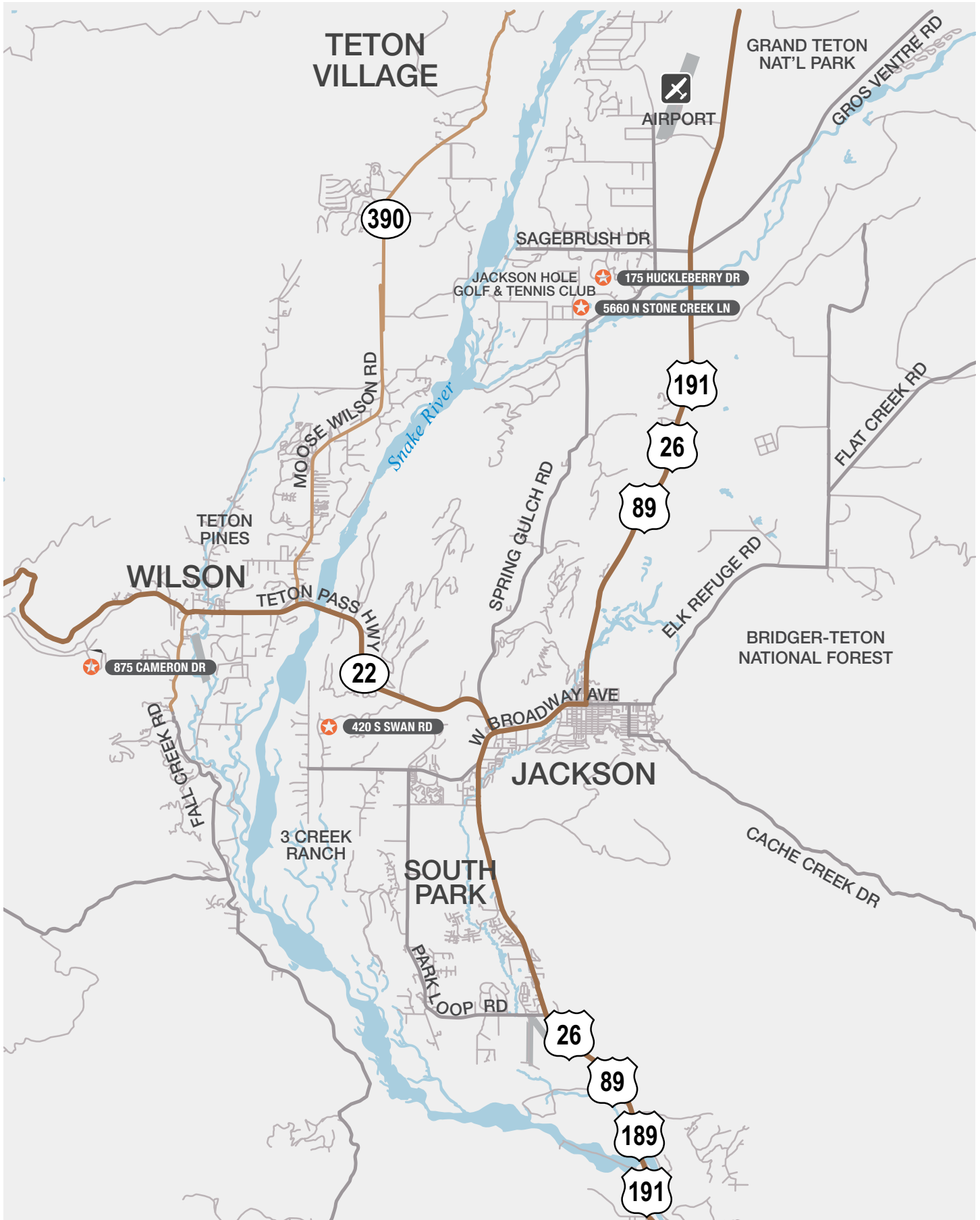

Inspired by sweeping views of the Grand, this custom Jackson home brings the rugged character of its surroundings inside while layering in modern comforts. The open floor plan feels spacious yet grounded—the kitchen flows into the living and dining area, with a pantry tucked behind the range and refrigeration wall to keep the sink, dishwasher, and microwave out of sight. Oversized sliding doors, a rare feature in Jackson, dissolve the line between indoor and outdoor living, while hardwood floors and matching ceilings carry that natural warmth throughout. In the primary bathroom, Smart Glass Film shifts from light-filled to private at the push of a button. Local craftsmanship shines throughout, including a hand-built fireplace in the great room, brought to life through a collaboration with local talent Chris Lee of DA Architects and JH Builders. Thoughtfully built and beautifully finished, this home is ready for its next owners to make it their own.

- Turn left onto Cameron Rd for 0.4 mi
- Turn right for 108 ft.
- Turn left for 112 ft
- Destination is on your right

5660 N STONE CREEK LANE, JACKSON, WY **FROM THE JACKSON TOWN SQUARE**

- From Town Square, head North on Cache Street for 6.7 miles

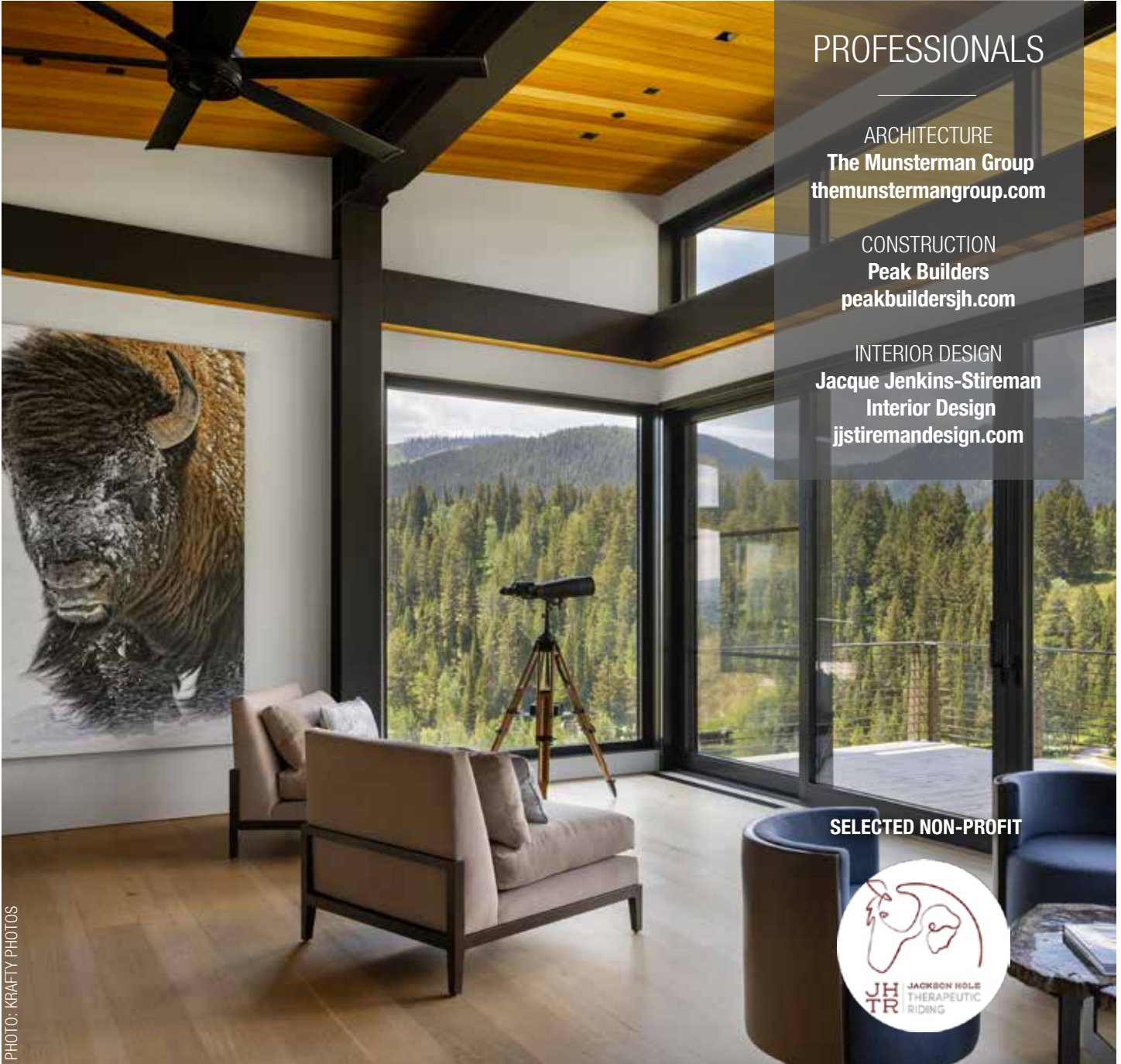

Set along a pond and framed by open meadow and mature vegetation, this home was designed as a contemporary interpretation of the traditional mountain retreat. A collection of simple gabled forms gives the architecture a quiet familiarity with the region while letting the house respond to its landscape on a more intimate scale. Natural wood siding, stone, and dark metal create a restrained mountain palette—refined enough to let the setting take center stage, warm enough to feel like home. Rather than simple openings in the walls, expansive glazing was carefully positioned throughout to frame views and draw the surrounding mountains, meadow, and water into the interior. The central living spaces open directly toward the pond and peaks beyond, blurring the line between indoor and outdoor living, while the home's composition creates a variety of outdoor spaces for the family to experience the landscape differently through every season.

More than 20 years ago, this property began as open land and a vision its homeowners could already see clearly. An artist herself, she imagined not simply a house, but how she and her late husband, a renowned Jackson Hole sculptor, would experience the landscape from within it—from where the bed would be positioned to capture views of the year-round stream and pond to how the home would connect with its natural surroundings. Working with Hoyt Architects and builder Tom Stoner, that vision came to life in 2004, crafted from reclaimed wood and stone. Over the decades since, the home, its gazebo and gardens have continued to evolve, shaped by the homeowner's own creative hand. Throughout the home, authentic Native American relics add another deeply personal layer to its story, making Native American Jump Start a particularly meaningful beneficiary.
